A famous Armenian scientist, Prof. Hrant Petrosian, was in Texas attending an international conference of saline water. He is the head of the Research Institute of Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry, which is part of the Ministry of Agriculture of Soviet Armenia. We had the pleasure to meet him on arrival from Erevan and spent one day with him discussing many problems concerning his achievements and he gave a phamphlet written by him entitled "Saline Soils Retreat" (translated and printed in English) which brings out the experiences in this field in Armenia. He was the only representative from the Soviet Union at the Texas international gathering. He has attended many conferences and is well known to experts in his field, including the experts in the United States, since we had the opportunity to be the interpretor between the Armenian professor and his American hosts who were extremely pleased that he attended the Congress.
